

ST LAURENCE CHURCH ORGAN

TECHNICAL DESCRIPTION

The organ was built by Messrs Bevington & Sons of London and was first used on Sunday 11th December 1911. It has three manuals, covering 46 notes each, plus 30 pedals. The action is all electric.

The Couplers are all electrically activated, along with all the Choir Stops and the Pedal Stops. The Swell and Great Stops are still activated manually, ie via rollerboards to the windchest, and the combination pedals (feet only) are manual too.
